- This resource guide serves as a quick and easy road map of City services currently available to all New Yorkers.
The City of New York supports all its residents. Most City services are available to everyone, including undocumented immigrants, like going to school or using the health care system or other services. City employees will not ask about immigration status unless it is necessary to do their jobs. They must keep immigration status information confidential.

- Guide of Government & Nonprofit Services for Recently Arrived Immigrant Children and Families.
 - Provides information on services available to recently arrived immigrant children and their families and caretakers. This guide is intended for use by New York City agencies, schools, nonprofit organizations, and immigrant children and families who may benefit from receiving information and referrals to City services and non-governmental resources that serve immigrant children and families. These services are available regardless of immigration status. City agencies are forbidden by Executive Order 41 to ask about immigration status unless it is necessary to determine eligibility for a benefit or service. City agencies that provide direct social services are required by Local Law 73 to arrange for interpretation in individuals' primary languages.
